TIP#4: TAKE CARE OF YOUR TREES!



Add native plants and leave leaf debris around their root zones to recycle nutrients and protect their roots from mowers.

TIP#5: GROW MORE PLANTS FROM SEED

Increase genetic diversity by allowing plants to reseed on bare soil. Or, sow native seeds in pots outside over the winter.

TP&G: LEAVE DEAD FLOWER STALKS



Stem-nesting bees utilize the pithy or hollow stems of perennial flowering plants and grass to lav their eggs. Cut standing stems to 12-18" high and watch native bees emerge throughout the year.
